

Farmers Insurance Group® UNCF National Scholarship Awards

Farmers® is proud to provide three new scholarship awards beginning Oct. 29, 2007, for the 2008-2009 academic year. This scholarship will be open to students from any state pursuing any major and attending one of the 39 United Negro College Fund (UNCF) member institutions or other historically black colleges or universities (HBCUs). This new scholarship is separate from the Emerging Scholars program and is designed to help students with financial needs associated with attending college.

Scholarship eligibility (students must meet all eligibility criteria for consideration):

- Student must be a U.S. citizen
- Student must be a resident of the United States
- Student must be enrolled full time in an accredited four-year UNCF member college/university or other HBCU
- Student must be a rising sophomore, junior or graduating senior
- Student must have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.8
- Student must show work experience (e.g. part time employment, internship, etc.)
- Student must be actively involved in at least one community service organization
- Student must have demonstrated financial need, verified by the college financial aid office

The scholarship amount for each of the selected award winners will be \$1,500.

All application materials must be received prior to the deadline (**March 3, 2008**). Upon verification of award status, payments will be made to the respective institutions of the award recipients for credit to their accounts for the applicable academic year. Award winners will be notified approximately two weeks after the application acceptance deadline. This is a non-renewable scholarship. Anyone awarded a Farmers scholarship within the past year does not qualify. Members of the Farmers family and their dependents are eligible to apply.

How to apply:

Submit the following documents along with the completed and signed online application:

- An official college/university transcript
- A letter of recommendation from a college professor
- A letter of recommendation from the community service organization where you are active/volunteering
- A 250-500 word essay (essay topic choices are listed in the online application)
